

Word from the Pastor

I got an email this last week advertising a service called "Sermon Spark." So I went to their website to check it out. It's a company that helps pastors write their sermons. For a small fee they will "find relevant quotes, suggest a biblical outline, compose a sample manuscript, and more." And they can do all of that in only one to two days. How do they accomplish it with such a quick turnaround you ask? Well, according to their website their researchers "use the latest technologies to streamline the process. Resources include web research, Scripture study, user contributed content from SermonCentral, original sources and commentaries, quotation databases, as well as generative image and text recommendations from various machine learning platforms." It was that last phrase that got me, "generative image and text recommendations from various machine learning platforms." In essence, they are using their database of sermons and illustrations and an artificial intelligence text generating program like ChatGPT to write the sermon.

For fun, I decided to go to ChatGPT and ask it to write a sermon outline for me on Psalm 124 and God's protection, a topic I recently preached on. Within seconds it came back with an outline that broke down the psalm verse by verse. It wasn't great, but it also wasn't all bad. Then I asked it to turn the outline into a manuscript. It very quickly did so. The manuscript was brief and wooden in tone, but it was a basic sermon. But where the program really gets impressive is with follow-up questions and commands. "Give me an illustration of an historical Christian figure that God protected," I asked. The program returned an illustration of Corrie Ten Boom hiding her Bible from the Nazis in a concentration camp. I asked, "Are there any important Hebrew terms in Psalm 124?" The program returned half a dozen interesting Hebrew words with their definitions and theological significance. It was impressive. Still, there are some significant pitfalls with using AI to write a sermon. While utilizing ChatGPT for drafting a sermon might offer convenience, it also presents certain risks. Sermons are not just about conveying information but also about sharing deep spiritual insights and connecting with the congregation on a personal and emotional level. Relying solely on an Al-generated sermon could lack the authenticity, genuine emotion, and spiritual depth that comes from personal reflection and spiritual inspiration. Moreover, Al-generated content might inadvertently misinterpret religious teachings or cultural nuances, leading to theological inaccuracies or offensive interpretations. A sermon is a sacred opportunity to guide and uplift a community, and while technology can be a useful tool, it should be approached with caution to ensure the message truly resonates with the congregation's spiritual needs. Full Disclosure: the previous paragraph, in its entirety, is a ChatGPT response to the prompt, "Write a paragraph about the dangers of using ChatGPT to write a sermon." Not bad.

Let me assure you ChatGPT will not be writing the sermons I preach, nor will any other program or web page or service. I take the process of preaching too seriously to do that. It's important that I study the text, wrestle with it, and allow God to speak to me through that process. I believe that process not only produces a better sermon, but it also produces a better pastor. I need to let the text speak to me first before I can say something to you. That is not a process I can delegate to a computer. Al is a powerful tool that will continue to improve and can be used in some cases to provide insight or information, however, it can
