Word from the Pastor

When I was around 14 years old my family started attending Wabash Presbyterian church, "The little church in the country with a whole lotta love." It was a small church situated on the plateau between Auburn and Enumclaw. It was surrounded by family farms and 10-acre plots with large homes owned by lawyers and doctors. The building was old and small. It probably held less than 100 people when full. There were wooden pews, with slats that creaked when you shifted your weight, a church bell that rang before the service started, and a small Sunday school classroom on the other side of the sanctuary wall. The hymns numbers were always listed on a placard up front. Someone got up and strummed a guitar for a few choruses during the offering. It was quaint and humble, and it felt like home.

That little church grew rapidly during my adolescent years from a community of around 150 to around 1,000 on any given Sunday. It was remarkable. Every week there would be new faces and you knew you needed to get there early if you wanted a seat. Of course, there were several remodels and expansions, multiple worship services, and eventually a brand-new building. It was a wonderful time and I look back with such fond memories. Oddly enough, I don't remember any of the sermons. Not one. I remember that the preaching was good. It was focused on Scripture, down to earth, and practical. But I do not remember any of the messages, maybe a joke or two, but none of the sermon points.

What I do remember is the people. I remember Don and Debbie Taylor who opened their home for a youth Bible study and told their stories about how they left a hippie drug culture and became followers of Jesus. I remember Spencer Nelson who led the youth choir with such enthusiasm. I remember Pastor Rex who had a photographic memory and knew every person's name. I remember so many wonderful people who welcomed me each week with joy and acceptance.

And this is how it should be. Jesus didn't say, "They will know you are my disciples by your doctrine." He said, "They will know you are my disciples by the way you love one another." The church does not simply preach a message of love, but it is called to live a message of love, to embody what we preach.

I am grateful to be serving a church today that also embodies God's love. Consistently, people tell me that coming to church at SPC is like coming home, a place where they are loved and accepted. They experience the presence of God in worship and the love of God in community. My hope is that we will continue to grow in our capacity to welcome others, build relationships, and experience the unity of God's Spirit. It's not about programs or strategies. It's about receiving and expressing the amazing love of God.

Men meet Thursday mornings at 8:00 AM in the Fireside Room This study is led by different men in the church. Please join us.


Soup & Bible Study
