## Word from the Pastor

For the past six weeks I have been functioning without the use of my right arm. It's been in a sling as I recover from rotator cuff and bicep surgery. This week I will be able to start taking off my sling and moving my right arm. I won't be able to lift anything heavier than a coffee cup for another six weeks. But I will be able to drive, do some typing, and lift and move very small objects. My full recovery is still a long way off, but I am well on my way and making progress everyday.

This experience has had me thinking about the nature of the church. The New Testament often refers to the Christian community as a body, the body of Christ. Paul writes:

Just as a body, though one, has many parts, but all its many parts form one body, so it is with Christ. For we were all baptized by one Spirit so as to form one body—whether Jews or Gentiles, slave or free—and we were all given the one Spirit to drink. Even so the body is not made up of one part but of many. 1 Cor 12:12-14

Paul then goes on to explain how all the parts of the body are important and necessary. He explains how no one part of the body is more important than another. It's a powerful metaphor for life in the Christian community. It's where we get our word membership-- we are all members of a body.

The thing about bodies is they are meant to be active. It's not a passive image. Bodies move. Bodies work. Bodies get things done. The Church of Jesus Christ is an active agent in the world, advancing the priorities of the Kingdom of God by sharing the gospel, loving our neighbors, and living lives of service. At Shelton Presbyterian Church we sum this up with our motto: Love God, Love people, Serve the world.

For the past six weeks I have learned how difficult it is to function when one part of the body is passive. I've been able to get by without the use of my right arm, but it has been difficult. I'm sure if this became a permanent disability I would learn how to function. Still, it's much easier when all the members of my body are working together. I want to thank all the members of Shelton Presbyterian Church that make this a healthy and active congregation. I want to thank you for the gifts that you bring and your commitment to serve. There are many challenges before us, but if all the parts of the body are working together, and together we are empowered by the Holy Spirit, then there's nothing that we cannot accomplish.
