When I was in elementary school, tether ball was one of my favorite things to play at recess. If anyone isn't familiar with the game – it basically is a ball hanging from a rope attached to a pole and the object of the game is to hit it above your opponent's head out of their reach until it completely wraps around the pole – then you win.

One of the advantages to winning tether ball is definitely height. For those who know me now at my great height of five-foot ¾, it's probably difficult to believe, but I was one of the taller kids in elementary school as I received all my stature by the age of twelve. So that was a definite advantage for me. Another advantage was strength – the ability to punch that ball hard enough to make it sail. I was built pretty solid, in fact my pediatrician called me his little football player, so I did have some strength. But to be really good at tether ball you also had to have skill. This was the ability to hit the ball just right so that it would cause it to fly over the heads of the tallest competitors. Skill was the real key to winning and any child, whether short or tall, could have that.

Our lives are filled with battles we must face. In the area of health - good genetics is a real advantage. Exercise and eating right can also help. But bottom line there are so many diseases that don't abide by any rules. They seem to pick people by random and it doesn't matter, your age, your sex, your ethnicity, or your economic status. Like the recent shingles commercial — they don't care! In these battles, we really need an advantage. I believe Jesus is that for all of us. Knowing and loving Jesus gives us the courage to face our fears and fight back. But Jesus is even more than that, because He can also provide both our medical providers and us with the skills needed to defeat whatever we're facing.
