WORD FROM THE PASTOR

You have probably heard the Latin phrase "ex nihilo" at some point in your life. In English it means "out of nothing." The term has traditionally been used to defend the concept that God created the world out of nothing, that is, without any preexisting materials. For much of my life, I assumed this was the "biblical" position. I assumed that the creation story of Genesis 1 described and supported this idea. I was wrong.

Genesis begins, "In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth. Now the earth was formless and empty, darkness was over the surface of the deep, and the Spirit of God was hovering over the waters." (Gen 1:1-2) The story does not begin with nothingness. It begins with chaos. The earth is formless and void-- without shape and empty. There is a darkness covering the waters (water is often a symbol of chaos in the Old Testament). The picture is of a dark watery existence, without life or light, where chaos reigns, but the Spirit of God, or wind of God (wind and spirit are the same word in Hebrew) hovers over the deep.

That's where our creation story begins, not with nothingness, but with deep waters, a dark unsubstantiated chaos. And then God Speaks, "Let there be light," and the darkness is contained by the boundaries of day and night. God continues by creating a vault (KJV, firmament) that separates the waters above from the waters below. God then separates the waters below to reveal dry land.

God is not so much creating at this point in the story as he is organizing. God is placing limits and boundaries around the darkness and limits and boundaries around the waters of chaos. In so doing, God creates a habitable space he then fills with plants and animals and humans that he creates. God orders the chaos and interjects light and life.

The creation stories of Genesis are not scientific or historical accounts. They are deep theological stories revealing the character of God, a God who transforms chaos into order and brings light and life into empty places of darkness.

Sometimes the world seems out of control. Sometimes our lives feel out of control. It can appear that the forces of destruction and chaos have the upper hand, but do not despair! Our scriptures teach us that God can bring order out of the chaos and shine his light in the midst of the darkness. Matthew tells us that when Jesus died on the cross, darkness swept over the land for three hours (Matthew 27:45). In that moment it appeared that the forces of chaos had won. But on resurrection Sunday, the light of God's power brought Jesus to life.

Hold fast to Jesus. Trust in the transforming power of God's Spirit operating in love. Let the Peace of Christ guard your heart, and may God bring order and light and life into your world.
