WORD FROM THE PASTOR

It's happened so many times in my ministry, that I almost take it for granted. I'm talking with someone after church and they tell me, "Pastor, it felt like you were preaching directly to me today!" And then they go on to explain how what I said dovetailed beautifully with the circumstances of their life, providing just the right words at the right time. I'm no longer surprised when it happens. It has happened so many times.

The skeptical side of my brain has a rational explanation for such phenomenon. It's just a matter of odds. Like the psychic who stands before a room full of people and says, "I'm sensing the letter, "M." Does anyone have a loved one who has passed over whose name starts with the letter "M?" In a large enough room full of desperate people, there's bound to be an "M." And if not, there are 25 other letters in the alphabet to work through. Faith healers use a similar strategy. "Is there someone here with a bad back? I'm sensing a bad back." Five percent of the population have chronic back pain. In an arena of 1,000 people that's at least 50 candidates, and more if you include the non-chronic variety. The same phenomenon occurs with preaching. Odds are a sermon will connect in a significant way with at least one person in attendance.

But I think there is more going on here than just the law of probabilities. I've seen how impactful a message can be, how beautifully God can fashion a word for the right person at the right time. Without any special knowledge on my part, sermons are often precisely what someone needs to hear. Sometimes this happens on the first Sunday visit. I heard that story a couple times in the last membership class. "It was my first Sunday, and you spoke just to me." The skeptical side can explain it away, but the mystic in me knows it is so much more. It's the voice of God. It's God's living word bringing encouragement in a way that only God can.

So don't be surprised if on some Sunday it feels like I've taken aim at a bullseye painted on your heart. It's not me. It's the Spirit of God speaking in a powerful and encouraging way. It's a blessing when it happens, not something we need to over analyze or explain away, just grace that we receive. I'm honored to be a part of it, but it's not really about me. I'm just an instrument that God is using that morning. So, when listening to the next sermon, keep your ears open and your heart open, and when you hear and experience the love of God, receive it, thank God for it, and walk in the truth that it brings.
