

We had just gotten home from a wonderful dinner at Budd Bay Café in Olympia, when I started receiving several texts from concerned friends about a brush fire. When they told me the address, I realized that it was just above us. We tried to drive near there but couldn't see anything. It was getting dark and around our bedtime. I realized that I was totally unprepared for a major disaster like a fire. What do I grab if the fire gets close? Our kitty Molly, pictures, important documents, medications? And what about our chickens? Do we let them go, so at least they won't get fried, but then the racoons and other predators will probably get them. I was really starting to worry. Would the fire fighters be able to warn us in time if the fire came down our hill? Chuck and I finally decided to pray and retire to our beds, although it was to a fitful sleep.

But in the morning when we woke up and all was still well; we thanked God that the fire was contained. I also realized that I need to be more prepared. I need to know where important papers and pictures are that I would want to take with me. The thing is – we always think that disasters happen to other people, not to us. But the horrible flooding of the Guadalupe River in Texas and the Bear Gulch fire here in Washington prove otherwise. We don't know what tomorrow might bring. So, we need to be prepared both physically and spiritually. My sister-in-law Cheryl's brother, Darren, his wife, their daughter, and family went to Hawaii on a wonderful vacation. They were all swimming in the ocean when Darren saw that his granddaughter was struggling to get back to shore. He dove in to save her. She made it back to shore, but her grandfather, Darren, sadly drowned. I'm not sharing this to scare anyone, I'm just trying to say – we just don't know when our time is up. As a friend told me, we all come into this world with an expiration date – we just don't know when it is.

Besides a will and health directives, what else do I need to do? Well, I finally have a date to update our will. It's a good thing because my kids who are all adults with their own children were still supposed to go to their Aunt and Uncle's. I also need to know where all the important things are so that I can gather them up quickly. But spiritually, am I ready? Have I reached out to all my family, friends and loved ones? Have I made amends to everyone I need to? I don't think I'm ready spiritually, either. But I hope to make progress towards that spiritual peace every day.

Sweet Lord, thank you for your wake-up calls. That brush fire was definitely mine. Lord, please guide us to know what you would have us do to be prepared for whatever may come. And each day let us become more loving to all - more like you.
