WORD FROM THE PASTOR

How many sermons do you actually remember? How many stand out in your mind so much so that you remember the points that were made, or the scriptures that were explained? If I'm honest, for me, there are very few. I remember a few jokes and stories that were told. I remember a few sermons that I disagreed with. But sermons that inspired me? Not too many. There are only a couple that stand out in my memory.

One such message was delivered to me when I was in college. I was attending Seattle Pacific University, and I often went to the Wednesday night worship gathering called Group. On the evening in question, the school chaplain, Steve Swain, was speaking. He was preaching on the commandment to "love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength and with all your mind and your neighbor as yourself" (Luke 10:27). I had heard the text many times (I grew up in churches), but this message was different for me. I heard something new.

There were two things from the message that stood out for me. First, he explained that to love God with all your mind meant that it was okay to ask questions, to pursue truth, to have doubts. There are no questions that are off limits. There is no truth that is not God's truth. We don't need to be afraid of the sciences or academic discovery. In fact, we should pursue the truth with vigor and without fear. Growing up in churches where doubt and questions were discouraged, I found this perspective liberating.

Second, the chaplain explained, that for him, to love God with your whole heart meant that all emotions were okay. Being angry or depressed or anxious is not a sin. They are normal human emotions. They are a part of how we are designed as human beings. To love God with our whole heart means to take those emotions to God, to express how we feel, and to find the encouragement, love, and strength that we need to walk by faith.

You can probably see in my teaching and preaching, how those two messages continue to inform my calling as a pastor. Some sermons do have a long and lasting impact. I continue to be guided by the truth that came to me in that message 36 years ago. It has born good fruit in my life. I am grateful.

As we move into the new year, I would encourage you to bring your whole self to God in worship. God sees you, and knows you, and loves you. Bring your whole heart, mind, soul, and strength to the Lord in 2026. You will not be disappointed.
